

Suspected *Clavibacter michiganensis subsp. Michiganensis* contaminated plants

A plantlet or a plant showing one of the listed symptoms can be considered as suspected plant. According to the judgement of a company's designated crop specialist with proper qualifications by training and/or education and/or practical experience, a sample of the suspected plant must be submitted to a recognized laboratory for further diagnosis.

Seedling

- Marginal necrosis on leaves
- Dark necrotic patches on leaves or stem
- Small white raised blisters on leaves
- Stunting of the plantlet
- Wilting of the plantlet
- Stem splitting

Adult plant

- Leaf yellowing and necrosis around leaf margins
- Interveinal discoloration becoming quickly necrotic
- Wilting of the older leaves
- Small dark spots on the fruit surrounded by a white halo

NB: The symptoms are not sufficient to be sure of contamination, only a positive diagnosis confirming the presence of *Clavibacter michiganensis subsp. michiganensis*.
